The Georgia Department of Education Awarded STEAM Certification to ArtsNOW Partner School: Virginia L. Heard Elementary in Savannah, GA

The Georgia Department of Education awarded Virginia L. Heard Elementary School with STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) certification! ArtsNOW has been a proud partner of Heard Elementary, and they are part of one of our federal grants for the past five (5) years. Serving grades prekindergarten through fifth, Heard Elementary became the first STEAM-certified elementary school southeast of Macon and the first STEAM-certified elementary school in Savannah-Chatham County. Heard Principal, Alonna Curry, says, "Words can't describe how excited our students and staff are to be awarded STEAM certification. The students and staff have worked hard in solving real world problems within our community using science, technology, engineering, arts, and math." STEAM is the integration of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics infused with meaningful arts integration. To be awarded STEAM certification, schools must submit an application showcasing that they meet specific criteria, including evidence of teacher collaboration, business, industry, and community partnerships, high levels of math, science, technology, and arts instruction, and an integrated, project-based STEAM curriculum. This multi-year process includes a close collaboration between the school, the Georgia Department of Education, and ArtsNOW with multiple visits, professional learning, curriculum planning, student/faculty/parent/business partners interviews, and rigorous action planning for future growth and development. The school received a banner from the Georgia Department of Education to be displayed in celebration of their certification and we are SO proud of the progress the school







Angel Oak Elementary School: Officially Recognized as an ArtsNOW Leadership School

ArtsNOW President and CEO, Pamela Walker, and Executive Vice President, Crystal Collins, officially recognized Angel Oak Elementary School as an ArtsNOW Leadership School. They presented Judith (Judy) Condon, Principal of Angel Oak, with a leadership banner and celebrated their accomplishments at the first 2022-2023 Demonstration of Learning Day. Several school and district leaders from around the state attended to see high quality, engaging arts integrated instruction. Pam and Judy shared information about their transformative partnership and journey. Participants toured the school and observed arts integrated lessons at various grade levels. Following the observations, we facilitated a debrief and answered questions about the process as participants enjoyed lunch. It was a great day of process observing at Angel Oak.









Lancaster County, SC: ABC Partnership with ArtsNOW

Our district partnership with Lancaster County and Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) is going so well. Music consultant, Dr. Maribeth Yoder-White, facilitated a day of professional learning with teams of teachers from eight (8) local schools. Teachers learned music vocabulary and integration strategies that can be used in upcoming lessons throughout the school year. The following week, Maribeth taught demonstration lessons at each school and debriefed with teachers. Students were engaged in music integrated lessons in mathematics, reading, and writing.









Arts Grow SC Partnership: Local School Kick-offs and Implementation

ArtsNOW's partnership with Arts Grow SC is positively impacting multiple districts and schools throughout South Carolina. This month's highlights include Marshall Elementary in Orangeburg County, Ellen Woodside Elementary and Mauldin Elementary in Greenville County, and Andrews Elementary in Georgetown. We are so excited about this partnership made possible through the South Carolina Arts Commission. We had Shannon Green and Debi West, both visual arts consultants, engage teachers and students through professional learning and student demonstration lessons. Pamela Walker and Regi Strickland held kick-off events in order to introduce the partnership to the staff and to review the goals and learning outcomes for the project. This will be a two (2) year journey, and we are so excited about the impact this partnership will have on teaching and learning.













SAIL (STEM + the Art of Integrated Learning) Grant: Barrow and Cobb Counties

ALLSWOW continued supporting and leading out SAIL grant with Focus Institutes and lesson modeling with our partner schools in Barrow County

and Cobb County. Drama Consultant, Barry Stewart Mann, demonstrated how to integrate drama strategies into the math and science curriculum. Through interactive storytelling, improvisation and more, Barry engaged teachers and students in 3rd-5th grade math and science curriculum in meaningful ways. In addition, teacher leaders across all grant schools are refining their arts integration skills by connecting one-on-one with an ArtsNOW consultant through digital coaching. We are looking forward to music and dance integration professional learning days to continue the SAIL grant journey!







Reimagining and Accelerating Literacy through Arts Integration (RELAI): Supporting Literacy with Culturally Diverse Books

Reimagining and Accelerating Literacy through Arts Integration marks the start of the second year of our grant with books that foster a love of

reading. In addition to equipping educators with arts integration strategies to engage and empower young minds, the Innovative Approaches to Literacy (IAL) grant provides funding to enhance and update book circulations in school libraries. Media Specialists and Literacy Coaches at each partner school worked alongside the ArtsNOW grant team to curate relevant and culturally diverse books that support literacy. "The kids (and I!) are loving all of our new books!" shares Stamie Hershalman, Media Specialist at Cottageville Elementary. Providing high-quality books not only improves the book to student ratio, but also increases reading motivation, performance and frequency. ArtsNOW looks forward to sharing how the new additions to the fiction and nonfiction collection will empower students to express their culture and identity through various art forms.









THRIVE! Professional Learning: Savannah-Chatham County Public School System

professional learning for new teachers, in the Savannah-Chatham County Public School System.
